



The Sussex Knowledge Exchange and Impact Support Programme

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Applications under the early-stage policy engagement strand will be assessed against the following equally weighted criteria:

a. Relevance to current Policy:

The project's significance in informing, influencing, or challenging a current local or international policy.

b. Policy Partnership Engagement:

Evidence of involving the appropriate partners in the policy cycle and targeting the right audience to effect change.

c. Feasibility:

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3. Funding available and eligible costs

The maximum funding that can be requested is £5,000.

Eligible costs for both strands can include:

Research assistant costs via REED

Communication and Engagement:

Costs for non-academic publications and communications (e.g. briefings/video/podcasts/social media activity).

Capability Building and Deepening understanding:
